### Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN)

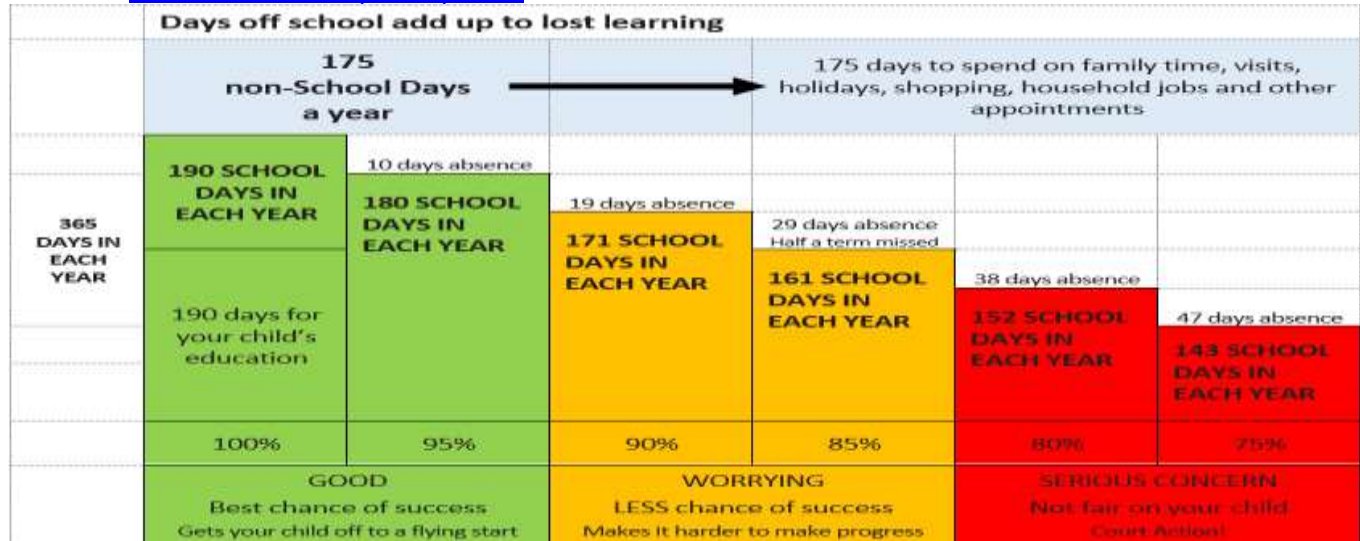
**Fixed Penalty Notices will be issued from September for 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absences.**

Applications for school/nursery can be made online via our website. In submitting an online application, you will receive an instant acknowledgment that your application has been received and you will be notified of the outcome of your application via email on the decision date, rather than waiting for a letter in the post!

There is a deadline for making your application. If you miss this deadline, or change your preference after the closing date, it may increase the possibility of not achieving a place at the school of your choice.

## What Children & Young People Need to Know about

# FREE VS HATE SPEECH

Everyone in the UK has the right of "freedom of expression". That's the right to voice your opinions and share information and ideas with others. It's not the right to say whatever you want without regard for others' feelings and values. We all have a responsibility to use this right properly; being respectful and inclusive to others. Whether online or offline, communication attacking or discriminating against groups or individuals (because of protected characteristics like race or religion) is hate speech, not free speech.

Free speech is a person's legal right to share information, opinions and ideas without fear of retaliation, censorship or legal consequences. This freedom of expression is recognised in international human rights legislation, and here's what it does for us in our day-to-day lives ...

The Human Rights Act 1988 states that everyone has the right to express themselves freely - even if their views are unpopular and might offend others.

Freedom of expression encourages listening to others and allowing opposing views to be heard. It's important to respect someone's opinion, even if we disagree with it. Free speech lets us engage in meaningful discussions with people who feel differently.

Any concept could potentially offend someone. Galileo's ideas were incredibly offensive to many at the time, while not everyone agrees with Darwin's theory today. Freely exchanging ideas promotes progress.

Free speech allows us to engage people we disagree with in a debate. The ability to challenge others' views is healthy - while having ours challenged helps us learn how to deal with criticism and think deeply about what we say and believe.

Free speech is a powerful tool for change, justice and reform. Many modern UK rights - such as women being allowed to vote or decent working conditions - couldn't have been achieved without it.

Freedom of expression includes the right not to do something, like not standing up for - or singing - the national anthem. Even though some people would find that offensive, it isn't illegal.

Hate speech refers to any communication - like talking, texting or posting online - which displays prejudice against someone's identity. Derogatory, demonising and dehumanising statements, threats, identity-based insults, offensive name-calling and slurs would all count as hate speech. Here are some common forms it takes ...

Targeting people or groups because of who they are - including but not limited to aspects such as race, sexuality, religion or a disability - and verbally abusing them with slurs and name-calling. The Equality Act 2010 has more information on this.

Content that dehumanises people based on those same attributes: referring to them as if they were animals, objects or other non-human entities, for example.

Calling for violence or hatred against certain people or groups and justifying and glorifying those actions.

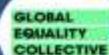
Claiming that specific types of people are physically, mentally or morally inferior (or even that they are criminals) to encourage others to view them in the same way.

Making up or repeating insults about a person or group because something about their identity is different to the person who's posting.

Promoting the segregation of certain groups, or discrimination against them, because of who they are.

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## Maths on Toast Bake-Off Maths Challenge

Are you ready to take on the ultimate maths baking challenge?

Practise measuring, explore spatial reasoning and tackle construction as you challenge your family and friends to see who will be crowned the best Maths on Toast baking champion.



### Measurement Challenge

Show off your baking skills by making 8 delicious maths muffins. Remember, an important part of the process is measuring out ingredients - so make sure your measurements are exact!

You may have your own recipe or if you prefer you can follow the one for choc chip muffins below.

#### What you'll need:

- 100g self-raising flour
- 100g butter (softened)
- 100g caster sugar
- 100g chocolate chips
- 2 large eggs (lightly beaten)
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract



#### Why's this maths?

Weighing and measuring ingredients will help you develop a better understanding of volume and measurement. Timing and calculation skills can help prevent soggy bottoms and burnt buns!

#### What to do:

Can you make 8 IDENTICAL muffins?

<p>1. Preheat the oven to 180°C</p>	<p>2. Cream the butter and sugar and gradually beat in the eggs and vanilla extract. Mix until smooth.</p>	<p>3. Fold in the flour and chocolate chips.</p>
<p>4. Spoon the mixture into muffin cases.</p>	<p>5. Bake for 20-25 mins.</p>	<p>6. Carefully remove from oven and let cool on a wire rack.</p>

Every special cake needs a special box!

Have you ever opened or unfolded a box along its edges? The unfolded flat shape is called a net.



## 3D Challenge

Get hands-on and produce the perfect box template (net) to display one or more of your muffins. Remember to think about how it will look when constructed into a 3D shape (make sure your muffin will fit!). What 3D shape will your net become? Perhaps a cube or a pyramid!

What you'll need:

- A piece of paper or card (card works best!)
- A ruler or an object to draw around

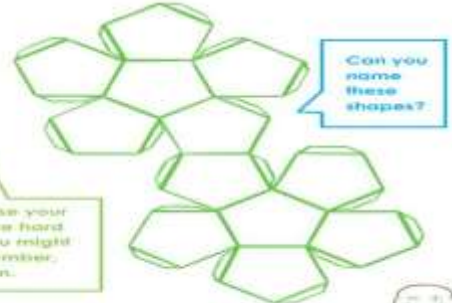
Why's this maths?

You'll be accurately measuring and drawing to repeat an identical shape and visualising how your flat piece of paper or card could become a 3D shape.



What to do:

1. Open out some boxes you have at home to see how shapes join together to form a net.
2. Use a ruler to draw your own or use a household object to draw around. Don't forget to add some tabs like the ones below.
  - Younger children may prefer to unfold and rebuild a box from home.



A tricky one! But a great opportunity to practise your perseverance skills. Sometimes challenges are hard and we make mistakes, but don't give up! You might find a new way of doing something and remember, making mistakes is good – that's how we learn.

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A cake box must be fit for purpose so it's time to put your construction skills to the test!



## Design Challenge

This is the really creative part, now it's time to construct and decorate your shape net, turning it into a fully functional cake box.

What you'll need:

- Your shape net
- Scissors
- Glue
- Pens, pencils or craft materials

What to do:

1. Carefully cut out your shape net.
2. Decorate
3. Fold the edges and put glue on the tabs. Then bring the sides of your net together to form a 3D shape - use the tabs to stick the edges.
4. Pop your muffin(s) inside!

Why's this maths?

Nets are a practical and visual way to identify properties of shapes, including faces, edges and vertices. You'll be constructing your own 3D shape from a 2D sheet.



Where will you design the opening of your box to be?
